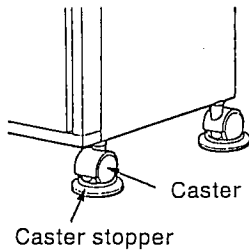


BEFORE USING

Installation

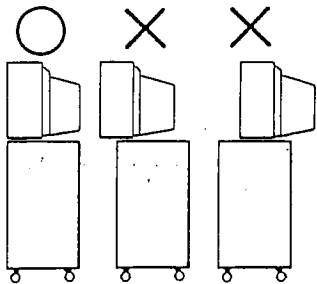
When you decide on the place of installation, set the included caster stoppers under the casters so that the system is stable.

- Make sure there is nothing on top of the system when setting the stoppers under the casters.
- The casters can be removed.
To remove: Pull the casters off.
To install: Insert the casters until you hear a click.
- The colours may be distorted if a TV is set directly next to the system, so set the TV 50cm or more away from the system.



Be careful of the following when setting a TV on top of the system.

- 25-inch TVs can be placed on top of the system. Do not place larger TVs or TVs which weigh more than 35kg on top of the system.
- Place the TV in the very center so that it does not stick out over the sides.
- Do not set any objects on top of the TV.



Moving the System

- Do not move the system with a TV or other component set on top.
When moving the system, remove all objects from the top and remove the caster stoppers.

If stripes appear on the TV screen:

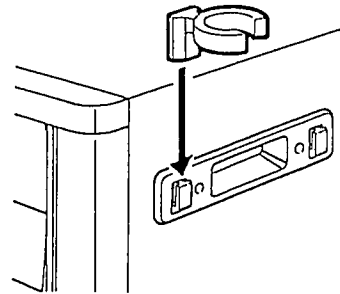
Depending on the strength of the TV broadcast signals, stripes may appear on the screen when watching the TV with the system's power turned on. This is not a malfunction of the TV or the system. Turn the system's power off if stripes should appear or when you plan to watch the TV for a while.

Notes:

- VHD format video discs cannot be used on this system.
- This system conforms to the NTSC format used in Japan. Discs marked PAL, SECAM, or other formats used overseas cannot be used on this system.
- The aluminum-backed discs sometimes used for professional LD singles (thin 20cm LDs) can be played without an adapter.
- Video single discs can also be played. Video single discs are CDV discs including video and digital audio parts.

Installing the Microphone Stands

Install the included microphone stands on the mounts located on either side of the system.



Condensation

- When cold water is poured into a glass, water droplets form on the surface of the glass. This is called condensation.
- Condensation may occur on internal operation parts and lenses.

SAFETY TIPS

Location

- Avoid places of high temperature and humidity such as the kitchen or bathroom, and also dusty areas.
- Do not place this unit anywhere near a cooking table or a humidifier where it will be exposed to smoke and steam as unit troubles may occur.
- Do not place this unit in an area that is directly exposed to the sunlight or near heating equipment such as a stove as it will adversely affect the cabinet and component parts.
- In cases where the unit is left in a car with all doors closed or in a similar situations where the temperature is abnormally high, cabinet warping and internal troubles may occur.
- Avoid placement on wobbling or unstable areas. (Level areas only)
- Avoid floor placement near any vibrating appliance or any area where vibration may occur. Doing so may cause unstable function of your unit.

Ventilation Hole

- In order to prevent internal temperature from rising, provided is a hole in the cabinet. When using this unit, caution must be exercised not to cover up this hole.
- Do not place the player in a narrow or unventilated spot such as a book case or cover it with a table cloth or such. Also, do not cover up the ventilation hole by putting it on a carpet or a comforter as problems may occur. Also, do not rest unit on any heat generating component such as an amplifier.

Do not place Objects On Player

- Please do not put flower vases, glasses, cosmetics, or any containers filled with pharmaceuticals, water, etc. if water spillage should occur, unplug unit and contact your nearest merchant, as usage may cause problems.
- Do not place any heavy (more than 35kg) objects on the player as damage to the cabinet, and possible future problems may occur.

Entry of Extraneous Substances

Please do not put or drop metals or combustible foreign matters through the disc lid or the ventilation hole of the player. To prevent entry of such extraneous substances, keep the disc table closed when not in use. If any foreign matters should enter, remove unplug unit and contact your nearest merchant immediately. As usage may cause fire, electrical shock or other technical problems. Extra caution should be exercised in homes with children.

When not in Use

When not in use, always leave the disc out and the power switch OFF.

Long Time Absence or Usage

In the case of a long time absence or usage, it is better to leave player unplugged.

Thunder Precaution

In case of thunder, unplug unit as quickly as possible, taking care not to touch antenna.

Cabinet Precautions

Do not remove cabinet of player, Handling the inside of unit is dangerous and may also cause additional malfunctions. For internal checks or adjustments, please inquire with your merchant's service department.

Playback Precautions

- The disc spins at a high speed during playback. Therefore, caution must be taken not to tilt, vibrate, or shock the player or to carry it around while in the playback mode, as malfunction may occur.
- Also, the player, while in use, may cause radio interference, if placed in the near vicinity.

Cautions for Carrying and Transportation

- When carrying the player, caution should be taken to avoid shock which may cause malfunctions.
- In case of moving or transportation, be sure to remove disc before packing. Also, be certain to remove the plug and outside connecting wires, such as aerial wires, TV connection wires, etc.

AC Power Cord Protection

- Do not place such heavy objects such as furniture, or carpeting, etc., on the AC power cords. Damaged cords may cause fire and/or electrical shocks. When any AC power cord is damaged, please replace at your nearest merchant.
- If AC power cords are located close to heating devices, take sufficient care so that cords do not come in direct contact with heating devices.
- When removing plug, do not under any circumstances pull on AC power cord, but instead taking hold of the plug itself.

Copyright Licensing

Duplication, broadcasting, screening, public performance, renting of discs without permission from rightful persons are strictly prohibited.

Taking Care of Cabinet

- When taking care of cabinet, firstly unplug the unit.
- Do not wipe unit with benzine or thinner, etc. as the quality of surface may change or peel.
- Do not allow volatile substances such as insecticides to be sprayed on unit. Also, do not leave unit in contact with rubber, or vinyl products, etc., for a long time. Plasticizer contained in the plastic materials may cause the quality changes or peeling.
- Lightly wipe any stains on the cabinet or on the front panel with a soft cloth such as flannel. For harden stains, soak cloth in neutral detergent, squeeze and then wipe stain with cloth and blot with dry cloth.

Unit Problems

It is dangerous to use unit if it emits smoke or unfamiliar odors. If this problem occurs the plug unit immediately and see your merchant's repair service department.

Dew Condensation

About Dew Condensation

- When cold water is placed in a glass, waterdrops adhere to the surface of the glass. This is dew condensation.
- Player internal mechanisms or lenses may also condensate under certain conditions.

How Dew Condensation Happens

The player will condensate if it moved from a cool area such as an air - conditioned room or car into a high temperature or humidity filled room within a short time, or when the player receives a directly cool wind from a cooling device or air conditioner.

When Condensation Occurs

A condensated player may not work as well as it should. Turn on the player and let it idle for a one or two hour period.

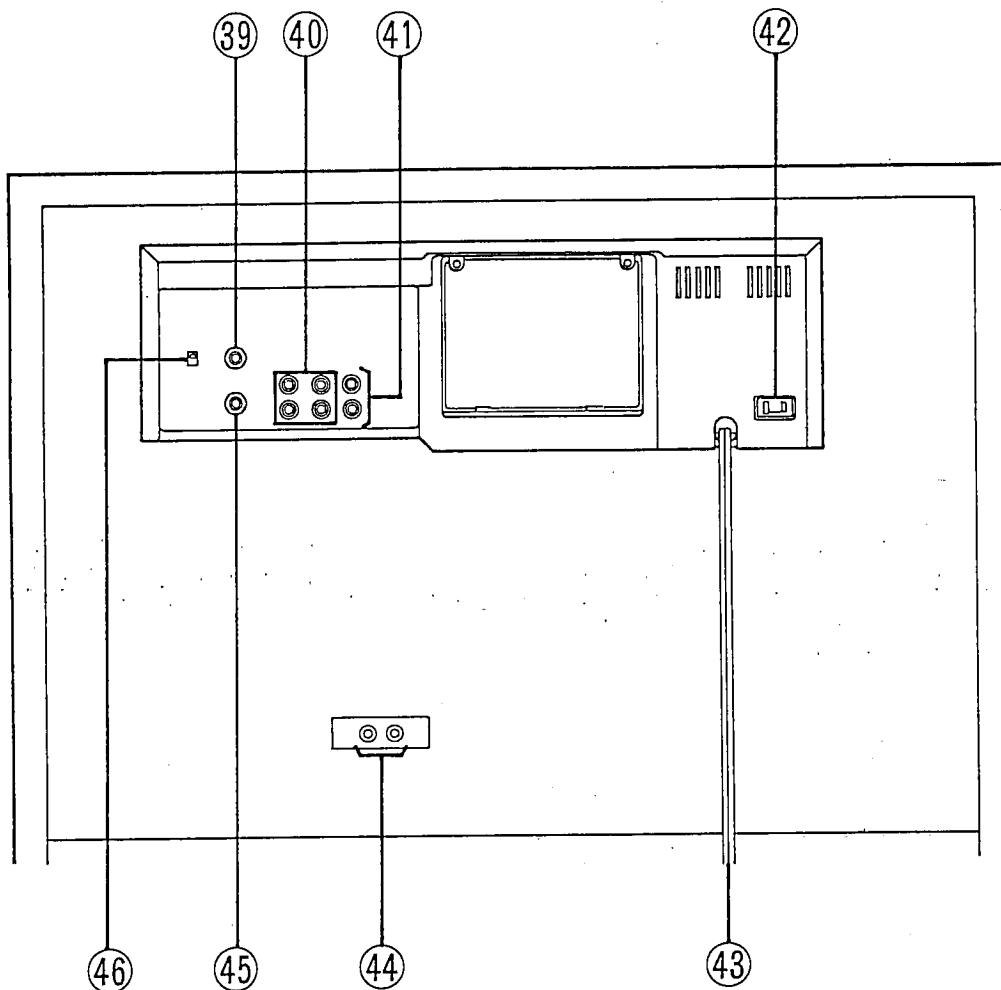
Headphones

- Use headphones (sold separately) at night and when you want to play discs quietly by yourself. Use the PHONES VOLUME control to adjust the volume.
- Keep the volume to an appropriate level to protect your ears. Also avoid using the headphones over long periods of time as this can harm your ears.



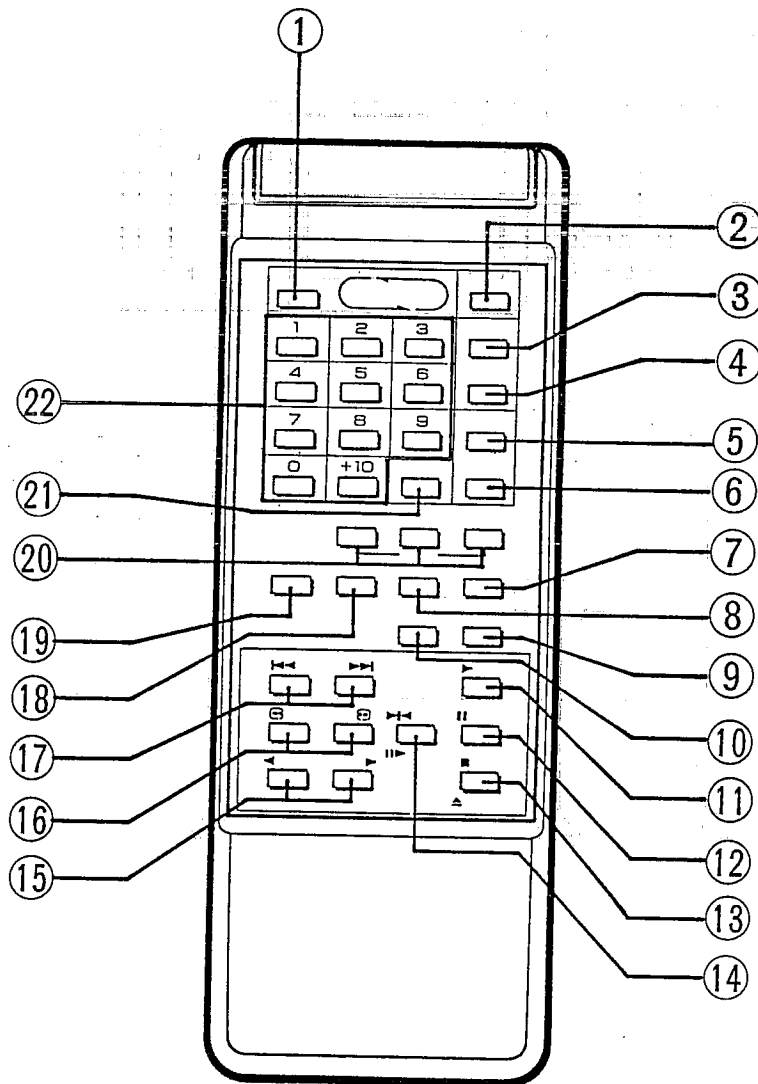
Rear Panel

39. AERIAL (ANTENNA) terminal
Connect the coaxial cable from the TV aerial here. re.
40. AUDIO 1 and 2 OUT jacks (Disc monitor)
Use these to monitor the audio output of CDs, CDVs and LDs.
41. VIDEO 1 AND 2 OUT jacks
42. POWER OUTLET (NON-SWITCHED)
Power is supplied from this outlet regardless of whether the power switch on the front panel is on or off.
The maximum output is 300W.
43. AC Power cord
44. AUDIO OUT jacks
For example, if they are connected to the AUX terminals on an amplifier, you can adjust the playback volume (karaoke) on the amplifier.
45. VHF OUT terminal
Connect the aerial input terminal.

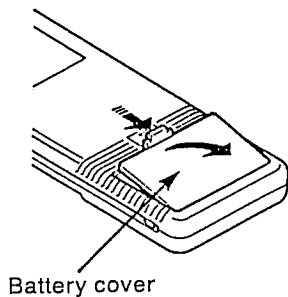

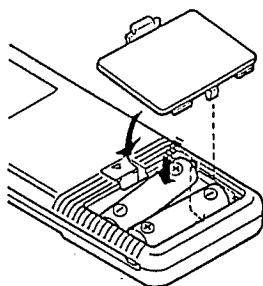


Inserting the Batteries

1. Remove the battery cover.
- Press the latch down and lift the battery cover up.



2. Insert the included batteries and set the battery cover back in place.
- Make sure the batteries are in the proper "+" and "-" directions.

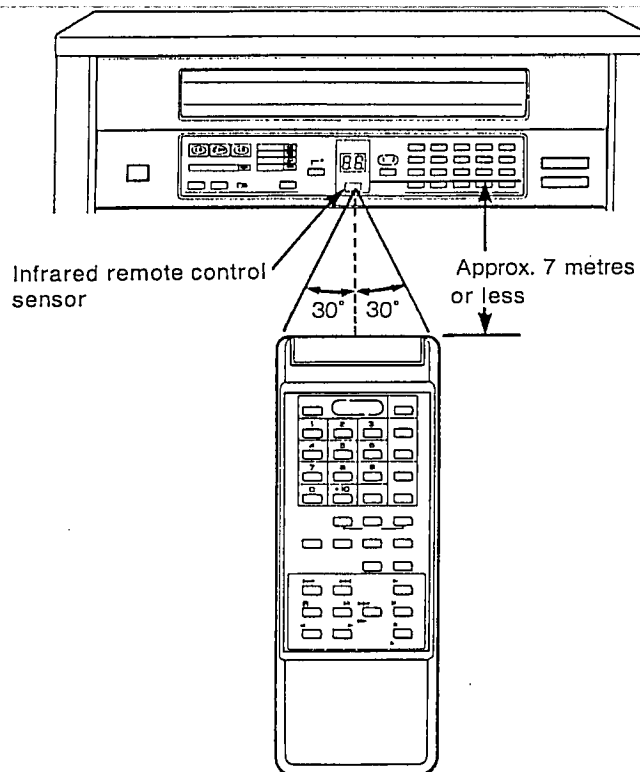


Notes on Batteries

- The batteries should last approximately one year, though this depends on usage conditions. (Replace both batteries with new ones.)
- Remove the batteries when you do not plan to use the remote control unit for a long period of time.

Operation

Point the remote control unit at the remote control sensor.















Remote Control Unit Operating Distance

The distance from which the remote control unit will function decreases if there are obstacles between it and the infrared remote control sensor. This distance will also decrease if the batteries become weak.

DISCS

The LV-K77 is a CD/CDV/LD-compatible disc player using the CD Video System. The six different types of discs shown below can be played on this system. The type of disc is indicated on the disc's jacket or label. All of these discs can be played on this system without using an adapter.

Laser Discs (LDs)

Standard (CAV) discs ... Constant speed

These discs are played at a constant speed of 1800 revolutions per minute. 30-minute discs have a playing time on one side of 30 minutes, and include a maximum of 54,000 frames. There is one frame per disc revolution, and each frame has a number, from 1 to 54,000.

The chapter search, direct-search, and programmed playback functions can be used with discs on which chapter numbers are recorded.

CAV: Constant Angular Velocity

Long-play (CLV) discs ... Constant linear speed

With these discs, the speed varies from 1800 rpms at the innermost section to 600 rpms at the outermost section. On 30cm discs, the playing time on one side is 60 minutes, and the elapsed time from the beginning is recorded on the discs. The chapter search, direct search, and programmed playback functions can be used with discs on which chapter numbers are recorded.

CLV: Constant Linear Velocity

Chapter numbers

These correspond to the chapters of a book, and are numbers indicating sections of the program on the disc. Read the disc's jacket, etc., to see if the disc contains chapter numbers. These chapter numbers can be used to easily find the section of the disc you want to see.

Frame numbers

These are the numbers of each frame on the disc, and are recorded on standard (CAV) discs. These frame numbers can be used to easily find frames you want to see.

Time numbers

These indicate the elapsed playing time from the beginning of the disc, and are recorded on long-play (CLV) discs. Use these time numbers to easily find the section of the disc you want to see by the time (minutes and seconds).

Discs including digital audio signals

On these discs, digital audio signals are included in addition to the analog audio signals. On this system, the digital sound indicator lights and the digital audio signals are played when playing these discs.

Digital audio signals are recorded with a higher volume than analog audio signals. Remember that the volume changes when switching between analog and digital audio playback.

Use the analog audio signals when playing a disc using an open channel on the TV.

Discs with the CX mark

These discs include codes for automatically turning the CX system on and off. The CX system will only function for analog audio signals.

(CX is a CBS trademark.)

Discs with picture stop signals

Some hobby and educational discs, games, and quiz discs include picture stop signals. When these signals are reached during playback, the disc automatically stops and a still frame is shown.

Karaoke laservision discs

When multi audio discs including digital audio signals are played on this system, it is possible to listen to either the digital or analog sound. Read the notes included with the disc.

Compact Discs with Video Signals (CDVs)

These discs include 5 minutes of video signals with digital audio signals along the outside (video part), 20 minutes of digital audio signals on the inside (audio part). Normal playback begins with the video part, followed by the audio part. Track numbers are recorded for both the audio and video parts.


Switching parts

Simply press the PART button on the remote control unit during playback of either of the parts to switch to the other part.

Track numbers

These numbers indicate different sections of the program on the disc. These track numbers can be used to easily find the section of the disc you want to hear.

TOC

In addition to the audio signals, all CDs and CDVs include TOC information at the beginning of the disc. This includes information on the number of tracks and playing times. LDs including TOCs are indicated by the  mark.

Handling Discs

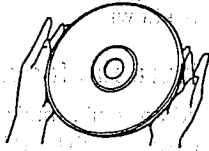
Always keep discs clean to ensure good quality pictures and sound. Dirt, scratches, warping, etc., will result in lower picture and sound quality. Protect discs as follows:

Holding Discs

Avoid touching the surface of the disc.

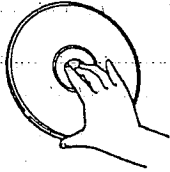
When holding with both hands:

- Hold the disc along the edges.



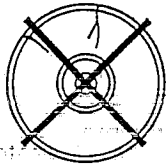
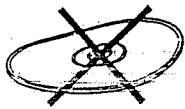
When holding with one hand:

- Hold the disc with one finger in the hole in the middle and another along the edge.



Do not use cracked or warped discs.

- The disc rotates at high speed inside the player during playback. Do not use warped discs, discs on which cracks have been repaired with glue, or discs on which broken parts have been taped or glued back on, as this could result in damage.
- Do not stick paper or stickers on either the signal surface or labelled surface of the disc, or write on the labelled side with ball-point pens, hard pencils, etc.



Cleaning

Wipe dirt off from the inner side towards the outer side.

- Use a soft, dry cloth to wipe dirt, dust, or fingerprints off the disc. For tough dirt, apply some neutral detergent diluted with water to the cloth, wring out thoroughly, wipe off the dirt, then wipe off any moisture with a dry cloth.
- Do not wipe around the disc.
- Do not use regular record cleaner, anti-static agents, or benzene, thinner or other solvents.



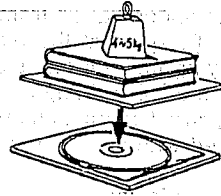
Storage

After playing discs, always remove them from the player, set them in their jackets, and store them vertically in a cool, dry place.

Discs may warp even in their jackets if they are stored at a slant or placed one on top of another. In addition, do not set discs in places exposed to direct sunlight.

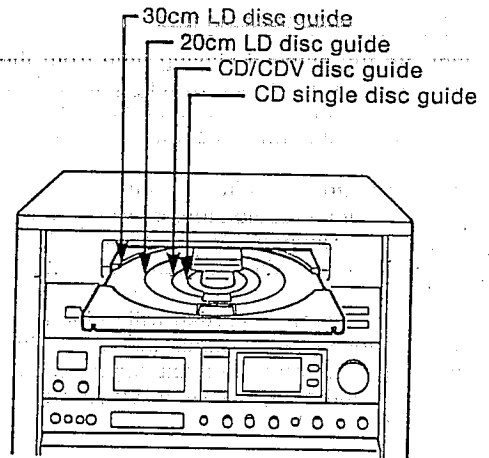
If a disc gets warped:

Put the disc in its inner pouch, set it between sheets of glass or other boards, put a weight of 4 to 5kg on top and leave for one day or so. This sometimes reduces the warping.



Disc Tray

- Load the discs securely into the proper guide.
- Only one disc can be loaded at a time. (Never set a 30cm disc on top of a 20cm disc.)
- Do not place heavy objects on the disc tray or press down strongly on it, as this could result in damage.
- Always keep the disc tray closed except when loading and ejecting discs.

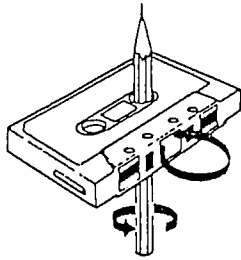


CASSETTE TAPES

Cautions

The cassette deck included with this system is for normal tapes. The sound may be changed or distorted if chrome or metal tapes are used. Also, avoid using the types of tapes described below, as this can result in damage. Use normal tapes to avoid problems.

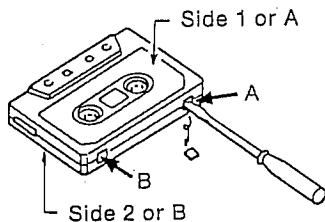
- C120 tapes are extremely convenient as they have a long playing time, but the tape itself is very thin and tends to stretch. If the tape is played, stopped, fast-forwarded or rewound repeatedly, the tape may get stuck inside the mechanism. Avoid using C120 tapes whenever possible.
- If the tape is slack, take up the slack before inserting it, or the tape may get stuck in the mechanism and bedamaged.



Use a pencil, etc., to take up the slack in the tape.

Protecting Important Recordings from Accidental Erasure

- When a recorded tape is recorded again, the previous recording is erased. Break off the accidental erasure prevention tabs on the back of the tape to ensure that important recordings are not erased accidentally.
- To record on a tape whose accidental erasure prevention tabs have been broken off, stick cellophane tape over the holes. When doing so, stick the tape on carefully so that the ends will not peel off.



- Break off tab A to protect the recording on side 1 or A.
- Break off tab B to protect the recording on side 2 or B.

Multiplex Audio Tapes

These tapes are designed so that you can practice singing along with the voice of a professional singer. The vocals and musical accompaniment are recorded on separate channels, so the balance between them can be adjusted using the BALANCE (multiplex audio balance) control.

- In general, multiplex audio tapes are recorded as follows:

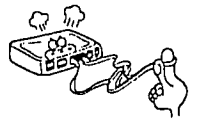

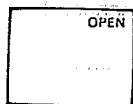
LOADING AND EJECTING DISCS

Loading Discs

1. Press the POWER switch.



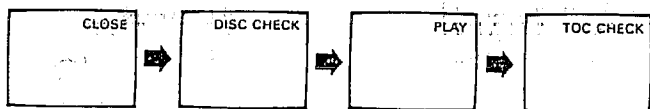
2. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button:



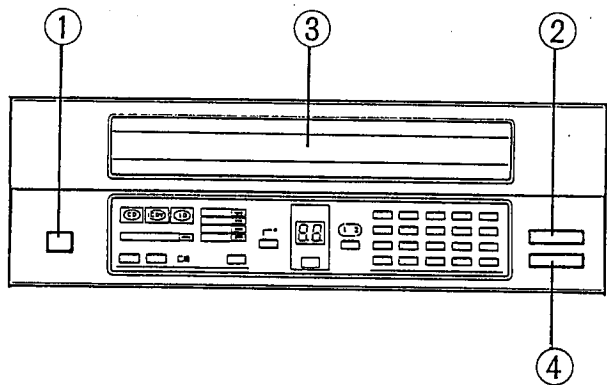
3. Set the disc in the guides.



4. Press the PLAY button.

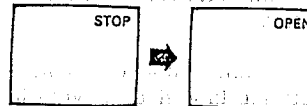


- When the single stop mode is set, "PAUSE" is displayed and the pause mode is set. When the continuous playback mode is set, playback starts.

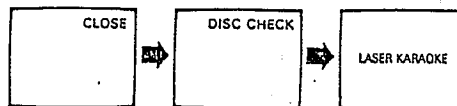


Ejecting Discs

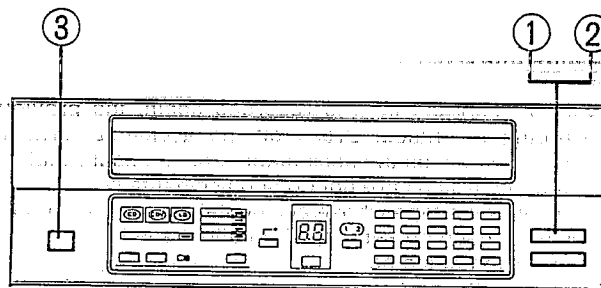
1. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button.



- The disc tray opens out.
2. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button.



- The disc tray is drawn in.
3. Press the POWER switch.
- The picture on the TV turns off and all the indicators turn off.



NOTES:

- If nothing happens when operating buttons are pressed, press the OPEN/CLOSE button and try reloading the disc.
- A popping sound may be heard if the main volume is high when the power is turned on and off, so keep the main volume turned down when turning the power on and off.
- Fingerprints or dirt on the surface of the disc will reduce sound and picture quality, so clean discs before loading them.

PLAYING KARAOKE DISCS (SINGLE STOP MODE)

Preparing the TV

- (1) Turn on the TV's power.
- (2) Check the type of TV.

For TVs without AV jacks:

(Connected to the AERIAL (ANTENNA) terminal)

- Set the TV to the video channel, channel 1 or channel 2.

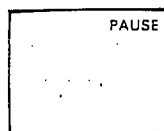
For TVs with AV jacks:

(Connected to the VIDEO and AUDIO IN jacks)

- Set the TV's input to "video".

Playing Digital Audio Multiplex Discs in the Single Stop Mode

1. Press the POWER switch.
When the KARAOKE MODE indicator is lit, the single stop mode is set, and when the indicator is off, the continuous playback mode is set.
 - The single stop mode is set automatically when the power is turned on.
 - To set the continuous playback mode, press the KARAOKE MODE button.
2. Connect the microphone to the MIC jacks.
 - Connect two microphones for duets.
 - Make sure that the MIC LEVEL controls are set to the minimum before connecting the microphones.
3. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button
4. Load the disc.
5. Press the PLAY button.



- After several seconds, the pause mode is set and "PAUSE" is displayed.
6. Press the direct search button for the desired song.
 - Playback starts from the song whose button is pressed. (For example, when button 5 is pressed, playback starts from the 5th song on the disc.)
 - When that song ends, the pause mode is set and "PAUSE" is displayed.

To select another song in the single stop mode:

Press the direct search button for the desired song.

To change the song currently playing:

Press the direct search button for the desired song.

7. Adjust the VOLUME control.
8. Adjust the BALANCE POWERFUL SOUND, and MUSIC LEVEL controls.
9. Adjust the MIC LEVEL and DIGITAL ECHO controls.
10. Readjust the VOLUME control.

Listening only to the music (digital):

- The digital audio mode is set automatically when digital audio discs are played.
- The DIGITAL indicator lights.

Listening to multiplex sound (analog):

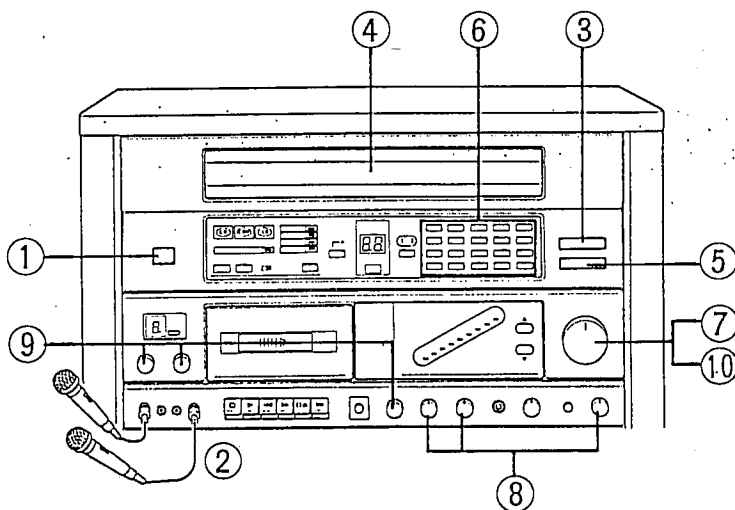
- Select the analog mode to listen to the singer's voice as well.

- (1) Set the BALANCE control to the VOCAL side.
- (2) Press the DIGITAL/ANALOG button on either the main unit or the remote control unit to set the analog mode.
 - The DIGITAL indicator turns off.

To sing a song on the other side:

For example, to sing the 7th song on the other side:

- (1) Press JET TURN (SIDE) button.
- (2) Press direct search button 7.



PLAYING KARAOKE TAPES

1. Press the POWER switch.
2. Press the STOP/EJECT button.
3. Insert the tape, then close the cassette compartment.
4. Press the TAPE button (the TAPE button lights).
 - The disc playback mode is set automatically (the DISC button lights) when the power is turned on.
5. Connect the microphone to the MIC jacks.
 - Connect two microphones for duets.
 - Make sure that the MIC LEVEL controls are set to the minimum before connecting the microphones.
6. Press the PLAY button.
7. Adjust the VOLUME control.
8. Adjust the BALANCE, POWERFUL SOUND, and MUSIC LEVEL controls.
9. Adjust the MIC LEVEL and DIGITAL ECHO controls.
10. Readjust the VOLUME control.

NOTE:

- When listening to tapes recorded in stereo, the sound is monaural if a microphone is connected to one of the MIC jacks.

To stop playback

Press the STOP/EJECT button.

To stop playback temporarily

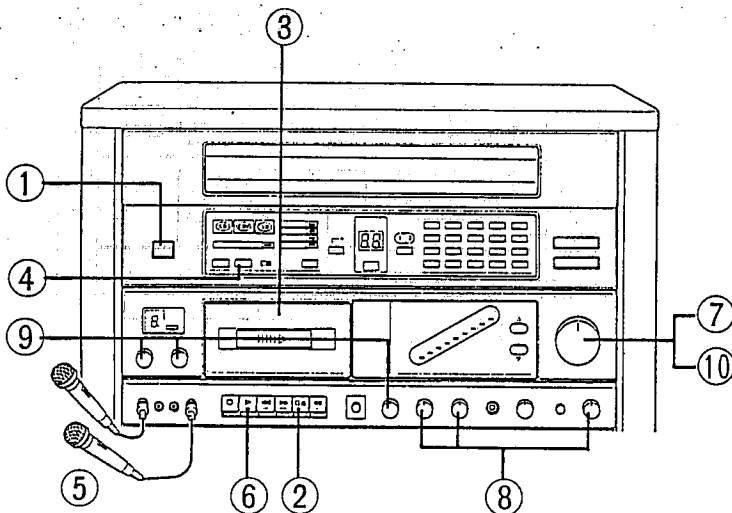
Press the PAUSE button. Press it again to resume playback.

To fast forward

- (1) First press the STOP/EJECT button.
- (2) Press the FF button.
- (3) When the tape reaches the end, press the STOP/EJECT button.

To fast rewind

- (1) First press the STOP/EJECT button.
- (2) Press the REW button.
- (3) When the tape reaches the end, press the STOP/EJECT button.

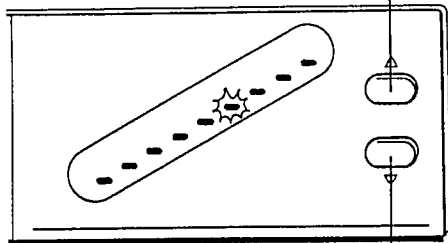


KARAOKE ADJUSTMENTS

Adjusting the Key on the Main Unit

When the power is turned on, the indicator at the centre of the key control display is lit, indicating standard key.

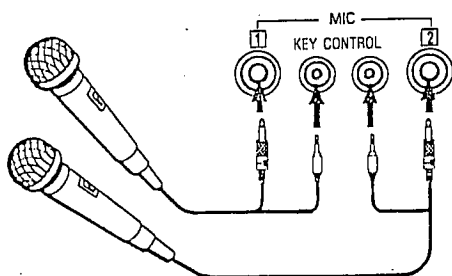
Press this button to raise the key.



Press this button to lower the key.

Adjusting the Key on Microphones with Key Control Switches (sold separately)

- When using a microphone with a key control switch, connect the microphone to one of the KEY CONTROL jacks then operate the key control switch. For details, refer to the microphone's manual. (Separately sold microphone: KA-HM-F70)



NOTE:

The key returns to the standard key (with the indicator at the centre lit) after one song is ended in the single stop mode, and when the disc is ejected.

Listening to the Singer's Voice with Digital Stereo Sound

When listening to digital multiplex karaoke discs (LDs) in the digital audio mode, press the DIGITAL MULTIPLE AUDIO button to listen to the singer's voice with digital stereo sound.

DIGITAL MULTIPLE AUDIO



The button lights.

NOTES:

The DIGITAL MULTIPLE AUDIO button will not function (the button will not light) in the following cases:

- When not playing a digital multiplex disc (LD) (for example, when playing a CD, CDV, cassette tape, etc.)
- When the sound is not stereo
- When the analog mode is set

Adjusting the Vocals



Adjusting the Singer's Voice

Gradually turn the BALANCE control from the VOCAL side to the KARAOKE side and stop at the desired position.

Listening Only to the Karaoke Music

Set the BALANCE control to the KARAOKE side. The vocals turn off and only the karaoke music can be heard.

Replacing the Singer's Voice with Your Voice

When you sing through a microphone, the singer's voice is automatically turned off and only your voice is heard. If you do not sing or stop singing in the middle of the song, the singer's voice automatically turns on.

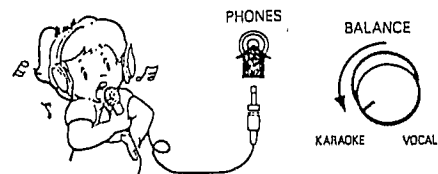


- Set BALANCE control to the VOCAL side.
- Press the VOCAL CHANGER button. (The button lights.)

NOTES:

- If the volume is turned up loud, the singer's voice may turn off even if you are not singing. This is caused by the sound from the speaker entering the microphone. If this happens, disconnect the microphone.
- The singer's voice may turn off if the sound entering the microphone is extremely soft or if the microphone is held too far from your mouth.

Turning Off the Singer's Voice and Listening to it Over Headphones



- Connect headphones to the PHONES jack.
- Set the BALANCE control to the KARAOKE side.

- Only the karaoke sound is heard from the speakers, but both the karaoke sound and the singer's voice can be heard over the headphones. Use this for karaoke lessons, and to sing along with the singer's voice with other people hearing only your voice.
- This function is not possible when the DIGITAL MULTIPLE AUDIO button is lit.

AUTO SEARCH ON CASSETTE TAPES

The auto search mechanism detects the blank, non-recorded sections between the selections on the tape to automatically stop at the beginning of a certain selection. Use this to skip to the desired selection on the tape, either from the beginning of the tape or from the middle.

Preparations

Insert the cassette tape.

- If the tape is not fully rewound, press the REW button to rewind it to the beginning.
- Check that the TAPE button is lit.

Searching for the 5th Selection from the Beginning of the Tape

- To skip to the beginning of the 5th selection on the tape, press the TAPE SELECTION button so that the display reads "4". This means that four selections will be skipped, stopping the tape at the beginning of the fifth selection.
1. Press the TAPE SELECTION button to display "4" one number under the tape at the beginning of the fifth selection.
 - The display changes each time the button is pressed, so press it until "4" is displayed.
 2. Press the PLAY and FF buttons.
 - When the tape is forwarded to the beginning of the fifth selection, the display returns to "0" and playback begins.

NOTES:

- When the TAPE SELECTION button is pressed, the display switches from 0 to 1 and up to 9, then returns to 1. Because of this, it is only possible to search for selections up to 9 selections away from the current selection.
- The search operation is not possible when "0" is displayed.
- Once the search operation is completed (in either direction), the FF or REW button pops back out.

Skipping Two Selections Forward from a Blank Section or from the Middle of a Selection (counting the current selection as the first selection)

1. Press the TAPE SELECTION button to display "2".
- Press the button the number of times necessary to display "2".

2. Press the PLAY and FF buttons.

- When the tape is forwarded to the beginning of the selection two selections ahead, the display returns to "0" and playback begins.

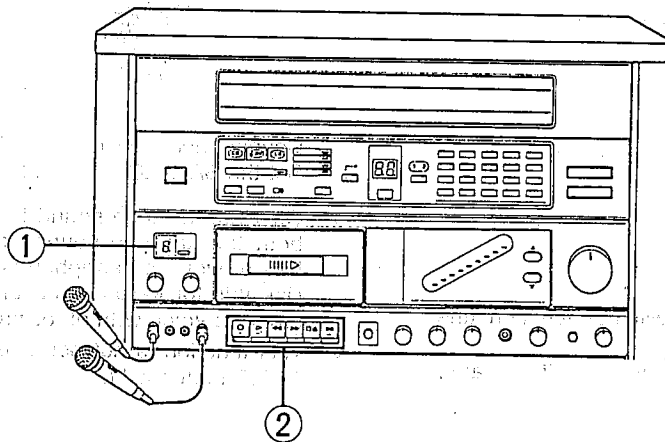
Skipping Backward Three Selections from a Blank Section or from the Middle of a Selection

1. Press the TAPE SELECTION button to display "3".
- Press the button the number of times necessary to display "3".
2. Press the PLAY and REW buttons.
- When the tape is rewound to the beginning of the selection three selections before the current position, the display returns to "0" and playback begins.

Notes on Auto Search

The auto search function works by detecting the blank sections on tapes (at least 4 seconds long), so it may not work properly in the following cases:

- When using tapes on which the sound is intermittent, such as tapes of meetings, dialogues, etc.
- When using tapes on which the blank sections are short (under 4 seconds.)
- When using tapes on which there are very soft sections in the middle of selections.
- When using tapes on which there is much noise between selections (the section between selections must be non-recorded).
- When using tapes which are recordings of records on which there is much noise between selections.
- When using this system near TV sets, etc., the signals from the TV may prevent the auto search function from working properly. If this happens, move the system away from the TV.



PLAYING LASER DISCS (CONTINUOUS PLAYBACK)

Preparing the TV

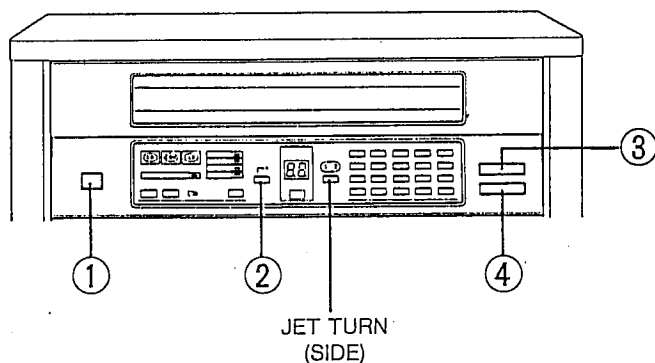
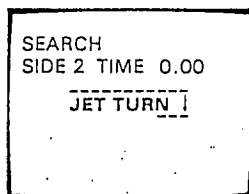
- (1) Turn on the TV's power.
- (2) Check the type of TV.

For TVs without AV jacks:
(Connected to the aerial terminal)

- Set the TV to the video channel, channel 1 or channel 2.

For TVs with AV jacks:
(Connected to the VIDEO and AUDIO IN jacks)

- Set the TV's input to "video".
1. Press the POWER switch.
 2. Press the KARAOKE MODE button.
 - The KARAOKE MODE indicator turns off and the playback mode is set.
 3. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button.

 - With discs on which signals are recorded on both sides, the disc can be played continuously without turning it over.

Stopping Playback (on the remote control unit)

- Press the STOP/EJECT button. The screen turns blue, "STOP" flashes then stops flashing, remaining lit.
- To see the disc again, press the PLAY button again to start playback over from the beginning of the disc.



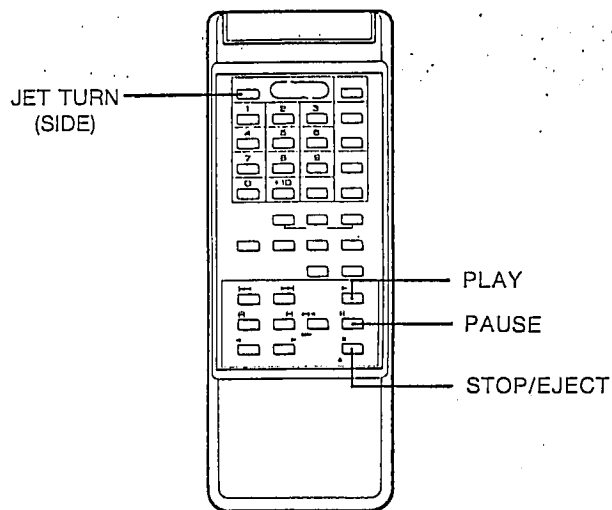
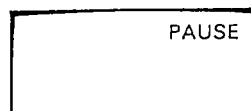
Stopping Playback and Ejecting the Disc (on the remote control unit)

Press the STOP/EJECT button twice. The screen turns blue and "STOP" flashes on it. "STOP" then stops flashing, "OPEN" appears, and the disc tray opens out.



Pausing Playback (on the remote control unit)

Press the PAUSE button. The screen turns blue and "PAUSE" appears. To cancel the pause mode, press the PLAY button or the PAUSE button again.



Switching Sides During Playback

Press the JET TURN (SIDE) button on either the main unit or the remote control unit.

- During playback, it is possible to switch from the currently playing side to the beginning of the other side simply by pressing the JET TURN (SIDE) button.
- If the JET TURN (SIDE) button is pressed again during the jet turn operation (before playback on the opposite side begins), playback returns to the side which was originally playing.

RECORDING YOUR VOICE ALONG WITH THE KARAOKE MUSIC

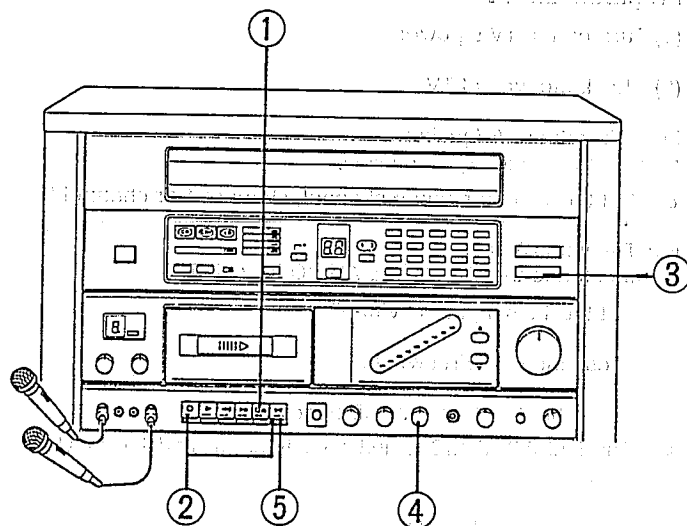
- Use a normal tape for recording.
 - Check that the DISC button is lit.
1. Press the STOP/EJECT button and insert the tape on which you want to record.
 2. Press the PAUSE then the REC button.
 - When the REC button is pressed, the PLAY button is also pressed in.
 3. Press the PLAY button to start playback.
 4. Adjust the MUSIC LEVEL control (recording level). Set the control to the "REC" position.
 5. Press the PAUSE button again.
 - Recording starts.
 - When the end of the tape is reached, the auto stop mechanism is activated and the recording and play buttons automatically pop out.

Erasing the recorded sound

1. Insert the tape you want to erase into the cassette deck.
2. Disconnect the microphones from the MIC jacks and set the MUSIC LEVEL control, MIC 1 and 2 LEVEL controls, and DIGITAL ECHO control to the minimum.
3. Press the REC button.

Recording the sound of a digital multiplex disc (LD) onto a cassette tape

The sound is monaural when the analog sound (karaoke music and vocals) is recorded onto a cassette deck. Also, the VOCAL CHANGER button and BALANCE control will not operate with cassette tapes.



NOTES:

- Recordings made on your cassette deck are for your own personal enjoyment and under copyright laws may not be used without the consent of the copyright holder.
- The recording differs according to the position of the various controls, so we recommend making a trial recording before the actual recording.
- Before recording, forward the tape a little to be sure to start after the leader tape.

SPECIAL PLAYBACK AND AUDIO FUNCTIONS

Scan forward, scan reverse, fast forward, fast reverse, and still and frame-by-frame playback are possible using the operations below.

Finding the Desired Section Very Quickly

Press and hold in the SCAN forward button (▶▶) to move forward, the SCAN reverse button (◀◀) to move backward.



- The picture will be disturbed for long-play (CLV) discs.
- No sound is produced for LDs and the video part of CDVs.
- Only a little sound is produced for CDs and the audio part of CDVs.
- Release the button to return to normal playback.

Finding the Desired Section More or Less Quickly

LDs (no sound is produced)
Press the FAST forward (◀) or FAST reverse (▶) button.

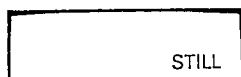


- For long-play (CLV) discs, the picture jumps.
- Press the PLAY button to return to normal playback.

Watching Still Frames and Playing Frame-by-Frame

LD Standard Discs (CAVs) (no sound is produced)

1. Press the STILL/STEP button once. "STILL" appears on the screen and a still frame is shown.



2. Press the STILL/STEP button again to move ahead frame-by-frame.
3. Press the PLAY button to resume normal playback.

NOTE:

The "SCAN FWD", "SCAN REV" and "STILL" indicators on the screen turn off after about two seconds. When normal playback is resumed, "PLAY FWD" is displayed, and this also turns off after about two seconds.

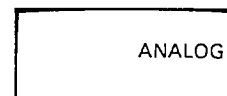
Listening to the Analog Sound of Discs Including Digital Audio Signals (Multi Audio Discs)

For discs including digital audio signals, the digital audio mode is set automatically when the disc is played.

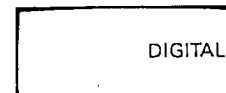
Press the DIG/ANA button.

- The sound from both the left and right speakers is analog or digital, according to the set mode.

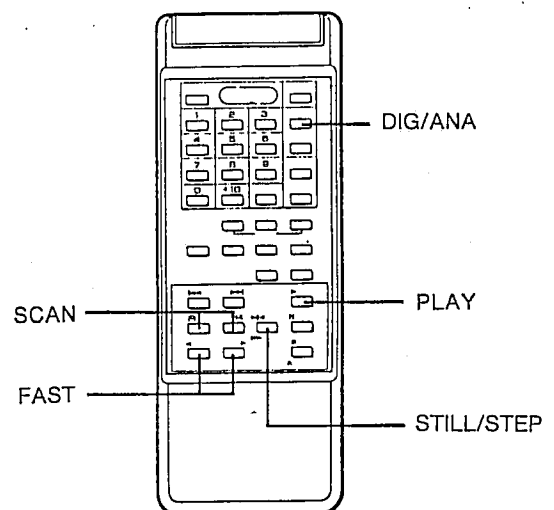

Operation on LDs without TOCs

- If a number not recorded on the disc is set in the programme and playback is started, "NO ADDRESS" appears on the screen after several seconds, after which the programmed chapters are searched for and played.
- If there is no corresponding chapter on the disc, "NO ADDRESS" is first displayed, followed by one of the indicators below. Set the programme over again or press a number button etc.

For the single stop mode: "END"
For the continuous play mode: "STOP"

Press the KARAOKE MODE button on the main unit to turn off the KARAOKE MODE indicator.
- To set the single stop mode:
Press the KARAOKE MODE selector button to turn the KARAOKE MODE indicator on.

- Selecting a non-programmed track in the single stop mode: Press the desired number (direct search) button. (The programme is cleared if this operation is performed.)

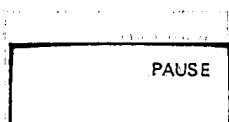

Changing the programme During Programmed Playback

The procedure for changing and adding to the programme is the same for LDs, CDs and CDVs.

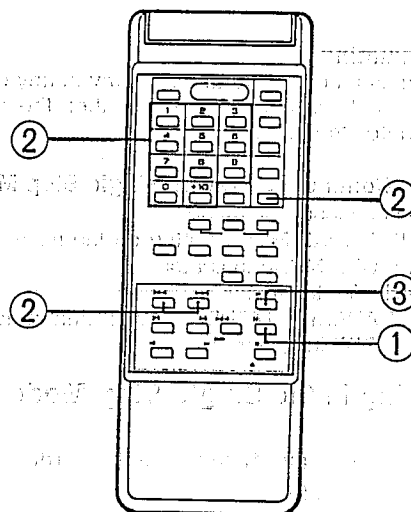

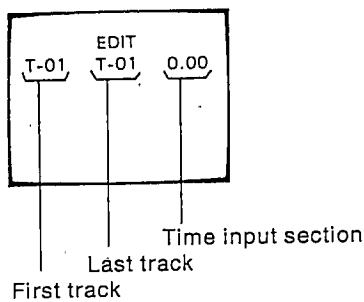


EDITING OPERATION FOR EDITED RECORDING ON TAPES

This is a convenient function for recording the tracks of compact discs onto cassette tapes. Simply specify the length of one side of the tape, and the times of the tracks on the CD are automatically calculated to fit on the tape.

Example 1: Edited Recording in Order from Track 1

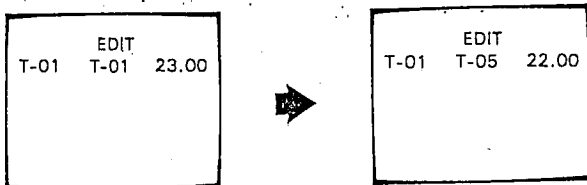
- Recording a CD including 12 tracks with a playing time of 42 minutes, 50 seconds onto a C46 cassette tape (23 minutes recordable on one side) in order from track 1
 - Input the recordable time on one side of the cassette tape.

23 for C-46 cassette tapes
30 for C-60 cassette tapes
45 for C-90 cassette tapes
1. Press the EDIT button.



- The pause mode is set when the EDIT button is pressed during playback.

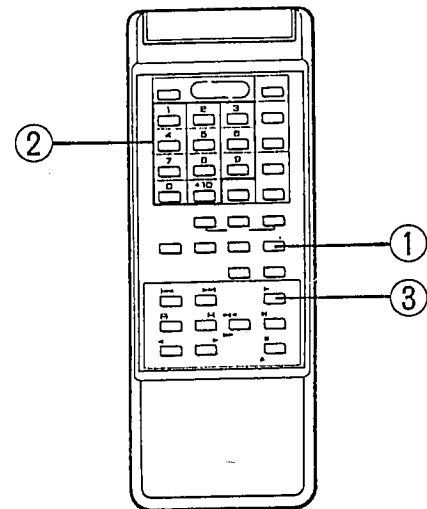

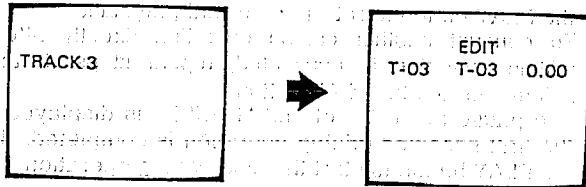

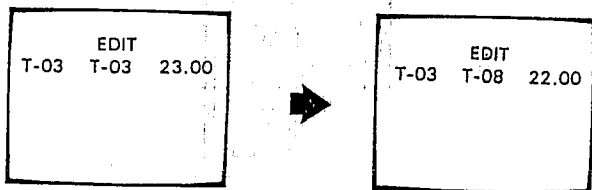

- Press the direct search button 3, then immediately press the EDIT button.

- Input the recordable time on one side of the cassette tape. Press the direct search buttons 2 and 3, in that order.

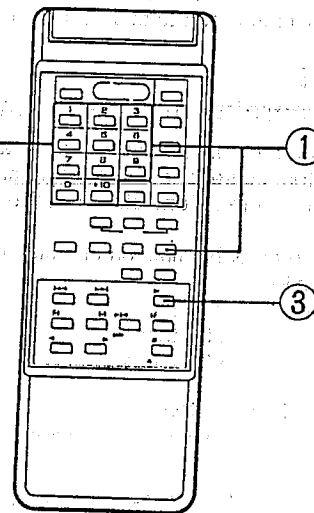

- The pause mode is set and "PAUSE" is displayed once the first specified editing operation is completed. Press the PLAY button to start the next editing operation.

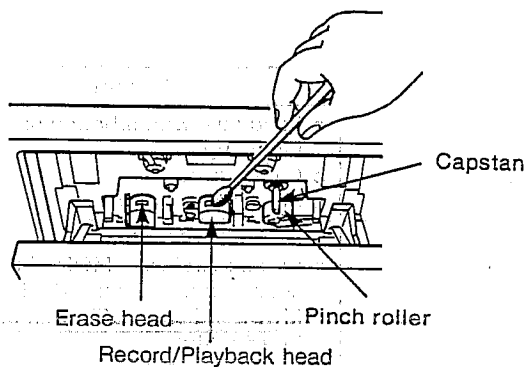
CLEANING THE CASSETTE DECK HEADS

Dirt on the surfaces which come in contact with the tape (heads, capstan and pinch roller) can cause the problems listed below during recording and playback. Wipe dirt off the surfaces of contact periodically.

- Poor sound quality
- Low volume
- Impossibility to erase
- Impossibility to record
- Tape getting caught on capstan

Cleaning

- Press the STOP/EJECT button to open the cassette door.
- Use a cotton swab to wipe off the dirt. For tough dirt, apply a little absolute alcohol or cleaning solution to the cotton swab.
- If you use a cleaning solution, wait until the parts have completely dried before loading a cassette.



Demagnetizing the Heads

After extended use, the heads become magnetized, resulting in noise or poor quality. Demagnetize the heads once a month using a demagnetizer tape, available in stores. Be sure to turn the power off when demagnetizing the heads. For details, refer to the demagnetizer's manual.
